INDEPENDENTS CHAPEL originally a cottage. *Erected* before 1800; converted into a Chapel. *Whether Separate* separate building. *Whether Exclusive* yes - and for an evening School. *Sittings* 50 all free; *Free Space* none. *On the 30th March Morning Sunday Scholars* none; *Evening General Congregation* 20. *Average Attendance during previous 12 months Morning Sunday Scholars* none; *Evening General Congregation* 20. *Remarks* Our meetings are held on the Sabbath Afternoon and also on a week evening. Attendance about 20 = Sometimes not so many - at other times above this number. *Dated* 28 March. *Signed* William Selbie, Minister, Great Horwood.
